Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 204—Relative to adoption.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

ACR 204, as introduced, Quirk. Court Adoption and Permanency Month.

This measure would designate November 2016 as Court Adoption and Permanency Month, and would encourage the courts and their local communities to join in activities to expedite permanency for children.

1 WHEREAS, Consistent with its commitment to support practices

2 and procedures that promote access to justice and improved case

3 outcomes for California's children and families, the Judicial

4 Council has recognized November as Court Adoption and

5 Permanency Month every year since 1999; and

6 WHEREAS, Half a million incidents of child abuse and neglect

7 are reported each year in California, and about 25,200 children

8 enter child welfare-supervised foster care for the first time; and

9 WHEREAS, Nearly 61,900 children in California live apart 10 from their families in child welfare: supervised out-of-home care;

11 and

12 WHEREAS, Thirty-eight percent of the children in foster care

13 in California have lived apart from their families for two or more

14 years; and

1 WHEREAS, Twenty-four percent of the youth in care are 2 transitional-age youth aged 16 to 20, inclusive; and

3 WHEREAS, Of the more than 29,600 California children who 4 left foster care in the 12 months preceding May 2016, 52 percent were reunited with their families, 21 percent were adopted, and 7 5 percent exited foster care without reunifying or obtaining a 6 7 permanent home by the time they reached the age of majority; and 8 WHEREAS, Local courts and communities throughout 9 California have created programs promoting permanency that have resulted in a reduction in the number of children waiting to live in 10 safe, stable, and permanent homes; and 11

WHEREAS, The Judicial Council remains committed to working with the Governor, the Legislature, and local courts and communities to ensure that every abused or neglected child finds a safe, stable, and permanent home with a loving family as quickly as possible; and

WHEREAS, The Assembly and Senate are committed toworking together to improve outcomes for children in the childwelfare system; now, therefore, be it

SUBJECT: Court Adoption and Permanency Month

SUMMARY: Designates November 2016 as Court Adoption and Permanency Month and encourages the courts and their local communities to join in activities to expedite permanency for children. Specifically, **this resolution** makes the following legislative findings:

- Consistent with its commitment to support practices and procedures that promote access to justice and improved case outcomes for California's children and families, the Judicial Council has recognized November as Court Adoption and Permanency Month every year since 1999.
- Each year in California nearly half a million incidents of child abuse and neglect are reported and about 25,200 children enter child welfare-supervised foster care for the first time. Nearly 61,900 California children live apart from their families in child welfare-supervised out-ofhome care.
- 3) Thirty-eight percent of the children in foster care in California have lived apart from their families for two or more years. Twenty-four percent of the youth in care are transitional-age youth between 16 and 20 years of age.
- 4) Of the more than 29,600 California children who left foster care in the 12 months preceding May 2016, 52 percent were reunited with their families, 21 percent were adopted, and 7 percent exited foster care without reunifying or obtaining a permanent home by the time they reached the age of majority.
- 5) The Judicial Council remains committed to working with the Governor, the Legislature, and local courts and communities to ensure that every abused or neglected child finds a safe, stable, and permanent home with a loving family as quickly as possible.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SCR 165, as introduced, Nguyen. Republic of Vietnam Month.

This measure proclaims the month of October 2016 as the Republic of Vietnam Month, in commemoration of the 60th anniversary of the adoption of the first Constitution of the Republic of Vietnam, in honor of the lives lost for freedom and democracy during the Vietnam War, and in recognition of the positive contributions of Vietnamese Americans to the State of California.

Fiscal committee: no.

1 WHEREAS, The people of the Republic of Vietnam (South

2 Vietnam) and the United States found common ground in their

3 shared principles of democracy and individual liberties, coming

4 together to valiantly defend these tenets against communism; and

5 WHEREAS, October 2016 marks the 60th anniversary of the 6 adoption of the first Constitution of the Republic of Vietnam,

7 which established that nation's first democracy; and

8 WHEREAS, Until the Fall of Saigon in 1975, the government

9 of the Republic of Vietnam sought to defend the lives, freedom,

10 and property of its people and was at the forefront of the fight for

11 democracy in Southeast Asia; and

12 WHEREAS, In an effort to protect the democratic government

13 of the Republic of Vietnam from socialist control, the United

14 States, Australia, the Philippines, New Zealand, South Korea,

1 Taiwan, and Thailand fought vigorously to aid the Republic of 2 Vietnam in their fight against communism; and

3 WHEREAS, Despite a valiant effort from countries around the

writekees, bespice a variant chort nonr countries around the
world, Saigon fell, compelling nearly three million Vietnamese to
flee the country in search of freedom and refuge in neighboring
countries with approximately half of these individuals perishing

7 at sea before reaching a safe haven; and

8 WHEREAS, The United States welcomed many Vietnamese 9 refugees following the collapse of the Republic of Vietnam, and today, the State of California is home to more than 500,000 10 Vietnamese Americans that enrich the social, cultural, and 11 12 economic fabric of our state through their significant contributions 13 to the fields of education, business, politics, arts, science, and 14 technology; and 15 WHEREAS, Today, the Vietnamese American community

throughout California and the United States remains vigilant of 16 17 the state of affairs of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam due to their 18 continuous infringement upon the liberties of its people, 19 specifically in the areas of child labor, human trafficking, religious 20 and political persecution, suppression of the press, unlawful 21 deprivation of life, forced disappearances, and land seizures; and 22 WHEREAS, Vietnamese American communities throughout 23 California and the United States continue to put pressure on the 24 government of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam with the hope 25 of bringing freedom and democracy to the people of Vietnam, 26 improving the quality of life of the veterans and disabled veterans 27 of the Army of Republic of Vietnam and drawing attention to the 28 plight of the wives of the fallen soldiers who continue to suffer;

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WHEREAS, For their brave resolution to defend freedom around the world, Republic of Vietnam Month seeks to recognize the sacrifice of the more than 58,000 American service members who lost their lives to defend democracy in Vietnam, as well as the more than one million people, including service members, supporting personnel, and their families, who made great sacrifices and contributions to the fight for freedom; and

WHEREAS, Republic of Vietnam Month also honors the
members of the Army of the Republic of Vietnam and government
officials, many of whom perished or were captured and held in
communist labor camps where they suffered unspeakable abuses,

1 as well as to recognize the sacrifice of their families, especially

- 2 the wives who displayed admirable courage in the face of tragedy;3 and
- 4 WHEREAS, To honor the great sacrifices made in the fight for 5 democracy, communities throughout California will dedicate the 6 month of October as a time to reflect on principles of freedom and 7 democracy and the sacrifices that have been made towards the
- 8 attainment of these ideals, as well as to commemorate the
- 9 anniversary of the first democracy of the Republic of Vietnam and
- 10 to thank the millions of veterans around the world who fought
- 11 during the Vietnam War; now, therefore, be it
- 12 *Resolved by the Senate of the State of California, the Assembly*
- 13 thereof concurring, That the Legislature hereby proclaims the
- 14 month of October 2016 as the Republic of Vietnam Month, in
- 15 commemoration of the 60th anniversary of the adoption of the first
- 16 Constitution of the Republic of Vietnam, in honor of the lives lost
- 17 for freedom and democracy during the Vietnam War, and in
- 18 recognition of the positive contributions of Vietnamese Americans
- 19 to the State of California; and be it further
