Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 91—Relative to Motorcycle Awareness Month.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

ACR 91, as introduced, Frazier. Motorcycle Awareness Month.

This measure would designate the month of May 2017 as Motorcycle Awareness Month in California.

1 WHEREAS, Motorcycle riding is a popular form of efficient
2 transportation and recreation for more than 1,000,000 Californians.
3 Motorcycles account for less than 5 percent of registered vehicles
4 in the United States, and they travel approximately 21,000,000
5 miles each year. Motorcycles provide a means of transportation
6 that uses fewer resources, causes less wear and tear on public
7 roadways, and increases available parking areas; and
8 WHEREAS, Through the Department of the California Highway
9 Patrol's California Motorcyclist Safety Program, the state trained
10 over 57,000 riders in 2016, and 1,100,000 since the start of the
11 program, along with the assistance of the California Office of
12 Traffic Safety, through education, and the Department of
13 Transportation's message boards. These efforts led to an 11.5
14 percent decrease in motorcycle fatalities, while at the same time,
15 total traffic fatalities in California increased by 4 percent, and
16 nationwide motorcycle fatalities increased by an average of 10

1 percent. California leads the way in training and safety for
2 motorcyclists and we are saving lives; and

3 WHEREAS, It is important that drivers of all vehicles be aware
4 of one another and learn to share the road and practice courtesy;
5 and

6 WHEREAS, The American Brotherhood Aimed Towards
7 Education - ABATE of California, American Motorcyclist
8 Association, Bay Area Riders Forum, Modified Motorcycle
9 Association, and the California Motorcycle Dealers Association
10 are organizations that actively promote the safe operation of
11 motorcycles, advocate for more rider training courses through
12 California Highway Patrol provider Total Control Training, and
13 advocate increasing motorist recognition of motorcycles; now,
14 therefore, be it

15 *Resolved by the Assembly of the State of California, the Senate*
16 *thereof concurring*, That the Legislature hereby designates the
17 month of May 2017 as Motorcycle Awareness Month in California,
18 and acknowledges the need for awareness on the part of all drivers,
19 especially with regard to sharing the road with motorcycles, honors
20 motorcyclists' many contributions to the communities in which
21 they live and ride; and be it further

22 *Resolved*, That the Chief Clerk of the Assembly transmit copies
23 of this resolution to the author for appropriate distribution.

SUBJECT: Motorcycle Awareness Month

SUMMARY: Designates the month of May 2017 as Motorcycle Awareness Month in California. Specifically, **this resolution** makes the following legislative findings:

- 1) Motorcycle riding is a popular form of efficient transportation and recreation for more than 1,000,000 Californians.
- 2) Motorcycles provide a means of transportation that uses fewer resources, causes less wear and tear on public roadways, and increases available parking areas. Motorcycles account for less than 5 percent of registered vehicles in the United States, and they travel approximately 21,000,000 miles each year.
- 3) California leads the way in training and safety for motorcyclists. Through the Department of the California Highway Patrol's California Motorcycle Safety Program, the state trained over 57,000 riders in 2016 and 1,100,000 since the start of the program. These efforts led to an 11.5 percent decrease in motorcycle fatalities, while at the same time, total traffic fatalities in California increased by 4 percent, and nationwide motorcycle fatalities increased by an average of 10 percent.
- 4) It is important that drivers of all vehicles be aware of one another and learn to share the road and practice courtesy.
- 5) The American Brotherhood Aimed Towards Education – ABATE of California, American Motorcyclist Association, Bay Area Riders Forum, Modified Motorcycle Association, and the California Motorcycle Dealers Association are organizations that actively promote the safe operation of motorcycles, advocate for more rider training courses through California Highway Patrol provider Total Control Training, and advocate increased motorist recognition of motorcycles.
