House Resolution No. 40—Relative to Red Nose Day.

9 partner enlisted, and red nose sold, the movement continues to
10 grow. Red Nose Day has raised over \$1 billion globally; and

11 WHEREAS, Since 2015, Red Nose Day in America has raised
12 over \$60 million to help kids and young people most in need; and

13 WHEREAS, Red Nose Day is a fundraising campaign run by
14 the nonprofit organization Comic Relief, Inc., a registered United
15 States 501(c)(3) public charity. Comic Relief, Inc., in the United
16 States and Comic Relief in the United Kingdom are independent
17 sister organizations joined by their shared vision of a just world,
18 free from poverty, and the mission to drive positive change through

- 2) Red Nose Day is a fundraising campaign run by the nonprofit organization Comic Relief, Inc., a registered United States 501 (c) (3) public charity. Comic Relief, Inc., in the United States and Comic Relief in the United Kingdom are independent sister organizations joined by their shared vision of a just world, free from poverty, and the mission to drive positive change through the power of entertainment.
