7 star from Whittier Christian High School, was a victim of a tragic
8 accident in the County of Orange caused by a heavy piece of metal
9 escaping from another vehicle and striking the car that he was
10 riding in, ultimately taking his life; and

11 WHEREAS, All residents of California should recognize the
12 dangers of driving, and be accountable for their habits while in a
13 vehicle; and

14 WHEREAS, Section 23114 of the Vehicle Code prohibits a
15 vehicle from being driven on a highway unless it is constructed,

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL’S DIGEST

ACR 242, as introduced, Gipson. California Manufacturing Day.

This measure would declare Friday, October 5, 2018, as California Manufacturing Day and would recognize the importance of California’s manufacturing sector. The measure would also commemorate California’s manufacturers as they continue to push the bounds of clean technologies that reduce emissions and increase energy efficiency in products and processes.

- 1 WHEREAS, California manufacturing represents 12 percent of
- 2 the national manufacturing gross domestic product and 10 percent
- 3 of the national manufacturing job base; and
- 4 WHEREAS, California’s manufacturing sector is dynamic and
- 5 diverse and includes industries such as advanced transportation,
- 6 aerospace, beverages, cement, communications and information
- 7 technology, consumer goods, energy and oil production, food
- 8 processing, glass, medicines and medical devices, mining, plastics,
- 9 paper and pulp, and steel; and
- 10 WHEREAS, California manufacturers continue to push the
- 11 bounds of clean technologies that reduce emissions and increase
- 12 energy efficiency in products and processes; and

1 WHEREAS, California manufacturers employ 1.3 million
2 workers with high-wage, middle-class careers that pay an average
3 salary exceeding \$87,000 annually and generate more than \$288
4 billion in annual economic activity that produces tremendous
5 multiplier benefits throughout the economy; and

6 WHEREAS, Many of the nation's most innovative, productive,
7 and energy efficient manufacturers have research labs, assembly
8 plants, and administration operations in California; and

9 WHEREAS, The nonpartisan nonprofit group, Next 10, found
10 in a report titled "2017 California Green Innovation Index" that
11 California's economy is the second least carbon-intensive economy
12 in the world and the most energy productive economy in the world;
13 and

14 WHEREAS, The average age of a manufacturing worker is 57
15 years old signaling an acceleration in retirement and turnover of
16 the California manufacturing workforce; and

17 WHEREAS, The global marketplace is demanding greater
18 innovation and technological aptitude that will necessitate a reliable
19 pipeline of highly trained individuals for California manufacturing
20 to remain competitive; and

21 WHEREAS, Many manufacturing companies continue to
22 experience difficulty in finding qualified candidates to fill positions
23 for machinists, electrical and mechanical technicians, maintenance
24 mechanics, automation technicians, welders and other
25 manufacturing jobs, most of which demand a rigorous level of
26 technical training, and

27 WHEREAS, The first Friday in October is designated as
28 National Manufacturing Day, which was created as an opportunity
29 to recognize and celebrate the contributions of manufacturing in
30 the United States; and

31 WHEREAS, On October 5, 2018, California will join the nation
32 in honoring the contributions manufacturing has made to our state
33 with more than 150 events that invite the public to come see
34 modern manufacturing facilities to promote interest in the
35 manufacturing sector as a quality career; and

36 WHEREAS, Many California manufacturing training facilities
37 and community colleges will also host events highlighting their
38 career technical education classrooms, equipment, students, and
39 instructors; and

1 WHEREAS, Working together with educators and workforce
2 development partners, California manufacturers will continue to
3 address the middle skills job shortage to build the next generation
4 of skilled industrial employees equipped to respond to the demands
5 of a global economy; and

6 WHEREAS, California's manufacturing industry continues to
7 be an essential contributor to the overall health and sustainability
8 of the state's economy and stands ready to help increase
9 opportunities for high-wage employment that will expand access
10 to the middle class for all Californians; now, therefore, be it

- 5) The first Friday in October is designated as National Manufacturing Day, which was created as an opportunity to recognize and celebrate the contributions and manufacturing in the United States. California will join the nation on October 5, 2018, in honoring the contributions manufacturing has made to our state with more than 150 events that invite the public to come see modern manufacturing facilities to promote interest in the manufacturing sector as a quality career.
- 6) Many California manufacturing training facilities and community colleges will also host events highlighting their career technical education classrooms, equipment, students, and instructors.
- 7) California's manufacturing industry continues to be an essential contributor to the overall health and sustainability of the state's economy and stands ready to help increase opportunities for high-wage employment that will expand access to the middle class for all Californians.

Additionally, California manufacturing is also the most efficient in the nation, producing 64 percent more product per unit of energy than other states and is the second least carbon intensive in the world.



1 WHEREAS, National Cancer Survivors Day is an annual,
2 treasured celebration of life that is held in hundreds of communities
3 nationwide, and around the world, on the first Sunday in June. It
4 is a celebration for those who have survived, an inspiration for
5 those recently diagnosed, a gathering of support for families, and
6 an outreach to the community. On National Cancer Survivors Day,
7 thousands gather across the globe to honor cancer survivors and
8 to show the world that life after a cancer diagnosis can be fruitful,
9 rewarding, and even inspiring; and
10 WHEREAS, National Cancer Survivors Day is a day for
11 everyone, whether a cancer survivor, family member, friend, or
12 medical professional. This day provides an opportunity for all
13 people living with a history of cancer, including America’s more
14 than 14 million cancer survivors, to connect with each other,
15 celebrate milestones, and recognize those who have supported
16 them along the way. It is also a day to draw attention to the ongoing

1 challenges of cancer survivorship to promote more resources,
2 research, and survivor-friendly legislation to improve cancer
3 survivors' quality of life; and

4 WHEREAS, Due to advances in cancer prevention, early
5 detection, treatment, and followup care, more people than ever
6 before are surviving the disease. In America alone, more than 14
7 million people are alive today after being diagnosed with cancer;
8 and

9 WHEREAS, Nonetheless, surviving cancer can leave a host of
10 problems in its wake. Physical, emotional, and financial hardships
11 often persist for years after diagnosis and treatment. Cancer
12 survivors are also at a greater risk for developing second cancers
13 and other health conditions; and

14 WHEREAS, Cancer survivors may face numerous challenges
15 during and after treatment, including (1) limited access to cancer
16 specialists and promising new treatments; (2) denial of health
17 insurance and life insurance coverage; (3) difficulty finding jobs;
18 and (4) economic burdens due to mounting medical expenses, lost
19 wages, and reduced productivity; and

20 WHEREAS, In addition to these challenges, cancer survivors
21 may face emotional struggles, strains on personal relationships,
22 and profound fear of cancer recurrence. The effects of cancer do
23 not simply end when treatment does; and

24 WHEREAS, The National Cancer Survivors Day Foundation
25 believes that more resources, research, and survivor-friendly
26 legislation are needed to improve the quality of life of cancer
27 survivors, both during and after treatment. The Legislature urges
28 everyone who participates in National Cancer Survivors Day
29 celebrations to not only recognize those who are living with a
30 history of cancer, but also raise awareness of the hardship cancer

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL’S DIGEST

ACR 245, as introduced, Acosta. Ronald Reagan Day.
This measure would declare June 5, 2018, as Ronald Reagan Day.
Fiscal committee: no.

- 1 WHEREAS, President Ronald Wilson Reagan, a man of humble
- 2 background, worked throughout his life serving freedom and
- 3 advancing the public good, having been employed as an entertainer,
- 4 union leader, corporate spokesman, Governor of California, and
- 5 President of the United States; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Ronald Reagan is the only person in California’s
- 7 166-year history to be elected to the offices of both Governor of
- 8 the State of California and President of the United States; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Ronald Reagan served with honor and distinction
- 10 for two terms as the 40th President of the United States of America,
- 11 in the second of which he earned the confidence of three-fifths of
- 12 the electorate in 1984, emerging victorious in 49 of the 50 states
- 13 in the general election—a record unsurpassed in the history of
- 14 American presidential elections; and

1 WHEREAS, In 1981, when Ronald Reagan was inaugurated
2 President, he inherited a disillusioned nation shackled by rampant
3 inflation and high unemployment; and

4 WHEREAS, President Reagan's commitment to the nation's
5 children helped lower crime and drug use in our neighborhoods;
6 and

7 WHEREAS, President Reagan's commitment to our Armed
8 Forces contributed to the restoration of pride in America, her
9 values, and those cherished by the free world, and prepared
10 America's Armed Forces to meet 21st century challenges; and

11 WHEREAS, President Reagan's vision of "peace through
12 strength" led to the end of the Cold War; and

13 WHEREAS, In 1987, President Reagan gave a speech at the
14 Berlin Wall where he famously told Soviet leader Mikhail
