**Introduced by Assembly Member Bonta
(Coauthor: Assembly Member Levine)**

February 8, 2016

An act to add Section 685.5 to the Insurance Code, to add and repeal Sections 12202.2 and 24330 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, and to add and repeal Article 6.7 (commencing with Section 14199.50) of Chapter 7 of Part 3 of Division 9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to Medi-Cal, and making an appropriation therefor.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 20, as introduced, Bonta. Medi-Cal: managed care organization tax.

(1) Existing law establishes the Medi-Cal program, administered by the State Department of Health Care Services, under which health care services are provided to qualified low-income persons. The Medi-Cal program is, in part, governed and funded by federal Medicaid Program provisions. Under existing law, one of the methods by which Medi-Cal services are provided is pursuant to contracts with various types of managed care plans. Existing law, until July 1, 2016, imposes a sales tax on sellers of Medi-Cal managed care plans.

This bill, on July 1, 2016, and until July 1, 2019, would establish a new managed care organization provider tax, to be administered by the State Department of Health Care Services. The tax would be assessed by the department on licensed health care service plans, managed care plans contracted with the department to provide Medi-Cal services, and alternate health care service plans (AHCSPP), as defined, except as excluded by the bill. The bill would require the department to determine

for each health plan using the base data source, as defined, specified enrollment information for the base year. By October 14, 2016, or within 10 business days following the date upon which the department receives approval for federal financial participation, whichever is later, the bill would require the department to commence notification to the health plans of the assessed tax amount due for each fiscal year and the dates on which the installment tax payments are due for each fiscal year.

This bill would establish applicable taxing tiers and per enrollee amounts for the 2016–17, 2017–18, and 2018–19 fiscal years, respectively, for Medi-Cal enrollees, AHCSF enrollees, and all other enrollees, as defined. The bill would require the department to request approval from the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services as necessary to implement this bill. The bill would authorize the department to implement its provisions by means of provider bulletins, all-plan letters, or similar instructions, and to notify the Legislature of this action.

This bill would establish the Health and Human Services Special Fund in the State Treasury, into which all revenues, less refunds, derived from the taxes imposed by the bill would be deposited into the State Treasury to the credit of the fund. Interest and dividends earned on moneys in the fund would be retained in the fund, as specified. The bill would continuously appropriate the moneys in the fund to the State Department of Health Care Services for purposes of funding the nonfederal share of Medi-Cal managed care rates for health care services furnished to specified persons, thereby making an appropriation.

(2) Existing law imposes a gross premiums tax of 2.35% on all insurers, as defined, doing business in this state, as set forth in the California Constitution. For purposes of the Corporation Tax Law, existing law sets forth items specifically excluded from gross income.

This bill would provide that the qualified health care service plan income, as defined, of health plans that are subject to the managed care organization provider tax would be excluded from the definition of gross income for purposes of taxation under the above provisions, as specified. The bill would reduce the gross premiums tax rate from 2.35% to 0% for those premiums received on or after July 1, 2016, and on or before June 30, 2019, for the provision of health insurance paid by health insurers providing health insurance that has a corporate affiliate, as defined, that is a health care service plan or health plan that is subject to the managed care organization provider tax imposed under the bill, as specified. The bill would require the State Department of Health

Care Services to annually report specified information to the Franchise Tax Board with regard to these provisions. The bill would authorize the board to implement these provisions and would exempt the board from the administrative rulemaking process.

Existing law provides that when the laws of another state or foreign county impose certain taxes or other amounts on California insurers, or their agents or representatives, the same taxes or other amounts are imposed in this state upon the insurers, or their agents or representatives, of the other state or country doing business in this state.

The bill would prohibit the Insurance Commissioner from considering the reduction of the gross premiums tax rate under this bill in any determination to impose or enforce a tax under those retaliatory tax provisions.

The bill would provide that these provisions become operative on the later of July 1, 2016, or on the date the Director of Health Care Services certifies in writing that federal approval necessary for receipt of federal financial participation has been obtained.

(3) This bill would include a change in state statute that would result in a taxpayer paying a higher tax within the meaning of Section 3 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution, and thus would require for passage the approval of $\frac{2}{3}$ of the membership of each house of the Legislature.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Franchise
2 Tax Board Legal Ruling 2006-01 (April 28, 2006) regarding the
3 treatment of apportionment factors attributable to income exempt
4 from income tax shall apply to apportionment factors attributable
5 to the income of qualified health care service plans excluded by
6 Section 24330 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, as added by
7 Section 4 of this act.

8 SEC. 2. Section 685.5 is added to the Insurance Code, to read:
9 685.5. The reduction in the gross premiums tax rate made by
10 Section 12202.2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code shall not be
11 considered in any determination by the Insurance Commissioner
12 to impose or enforce a tax under the retaliatory tax provisions of
13 Sections 685 to 685.4, inclusive, and reported pursuant to Sections

1 12281, 12287, 12288, and 12289 of the Revenue and Taxation
2 Code.

3 SEC. 3. Section 12202.2 is added to the Revenue and Taxation
4 Code, to read:

5 12202.2. (a) Notwithstanding the rate specified by Section
6 12202, the gross premiums tax rate for premiums received for the
7 provision of health insurance, as defined in subdivision (b) of
8 Section 106 of the Insurance Code, paid by an insurer described
9 in this subdivision shall be 0 percent for any of those premiums
10 received on or after July 1, 2016, and on or before June 30, 2019.
11 Only an insurer that provides health insurance that has a corporate
12 affiliate that is a “health care service plan” or “health plan” defined
13 as a health care service plan that meets all of the following
14 requirements, shall be subject to the rate change provided in this
15 section:

16 (1) Is licensed by the Department of Managed Health Care or
17 is a managed care plan contracted with the State Department of
18 Health Care Services to provide Medi-Cal services.

19 (2) Had at least one enrollee enrolled in the health plan in the
20 base year, as defined in subdivision (e) of Section 14199.51 of the
21 Welfare and Institutions Code, not including individuals who are
22 enrolled in a Medicare plan, who receive health care services
23 through a health plan pursuant to a subcontract from another health
24 plan, or who are enrollees through the Federal Employees Health
25 Benefits Act of 1959 (Public Law 86-382).

26 (3) Is subject to the tax imposed by Section 14199.54 of the
27 Welfare and Institutions Code.

28 (b) For purposes of this section, an “insurer that has a corporate
29 affiliate that is a health care service plan or health plan” means an
30 insurer that is, directly or indirectly, controlled by, under common
31 control with, or controls a health care service plan.

32 (c) This section shall remain in effect only until June 30, 2019,
33 and as of June 30, 2020, is repealed.

34 SEC. 4. Section 24330 is added to the Revenue and Taxation
35 Code, to read:

36 24330. (a) Gross income shall not include the qualified health
37 care service plan income of a qualified health care service plan
38 properly accrued with respect to enrollment or services that occur
39 on or after July 1, 2016, and on or before June 30, 2019.

1 (b) For purposes of this section, the following definitions shall
2 apply:

3 (1) “Qualified health care service plan” means a health care
4 service plan, as defined in subdivision (k) of Section 14199.51 of
5 the Welfare and Institutions Code, that is subject to the tax imposed
6 under Section 14199.54 of the Welfare and Institutions Code.

7 (2) “Qualified health care service plan income” means the
8 revenue listed in subparagraphs (A) to (J), inclusive, that is
9 associated with the operation of a qualified health care service
10 plan and that is required to be reported to the Department of
11 Managed Health Care pursuant to the Instructions for filing
12 Financial Statements and Section 1384 of the Health and Safety
13 Code and the regulations adopted thereunder.

14 (A) Premiums (commercial).

15 (B) Copayments, COB, subrogation.

16 (C) Title XIX Medicaid.

17 (D) Point-of-Service premiums.

18 (E) Risk pool revenue.

19 (F) Capitation payments.

20 (G) Title XVIII Medicare.

21 (H) Fee-for-service.

22 (I) Interest.

23 (J) Aggregate write-ins for other revenues, including capital
24 gains and other investment income.

25 (c) (1) No later than December 1, 2016, and annually thereafter,
26 the State Department of Health Care Services shall provide to the
27 Franchise Tax Board information regarding every health care
28 service plan that is subject to the tax imposed under Section
29 14199.54 of the Welfare and Institutions Code. The information
30 shall include the corporate name, address, and calendar period for
31 which each health care service plan is subject to the tax imposed
32 under Section 14199.54 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, and,
33 if applicable, the owner or owners of those health care service
34 plans.

35 (2) A qualified health care service plan with no income other
36 than qualified health care service plan income that is excluded
37 from gross income pursuant to this section for a taxable year shall
38 be exempt from the minimum franchise tax imposed under Chapter
39 2 (commencing with Section 23101) for that taxable year.

1 (d) The Franchise Tax Board may prescribe rules, guidelines,
 2 or procedures necessary or appropriate to carry out the purposes
 3 of this section. Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of
 4 Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code does not
 5 apply to any rule, guideline, or procedure prescribed by the
 6 Franchise Tax Board pursuant to this section.

7 (e) This section shall remain in effect only until December 1,
 8 2019, and as of June 30, 2020, is repealed.

9 SEC. 5. Article 6.7 (commencing with Section 14199.50) is
 10 added to Chapter 7 of Part 3 of Division 9 of the Welfare and
 11 Institutions Code, to read:

 13 Article 6.7. Managed Care Organization Provider Tax

 15 14199.50. It is the intent of the Legislature that the department
 16 implement a managed care organization provider tax effective July
 17 1, 2016, to provide ongoing funding for health care and prevention,
 18 minimize to the extent possible any need for new reductions to the
 19 program, and meet all of the following goals:

20 (a) Generate an amount of nonfederal funds for the Medi-Cal
 21 program equivalent to the funds generated by the tax imposed
 22 pursuant to Article 5 (commencing with Section 6174) of Chapter
 23 2 of Part 1 of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code.

24 (b) Comply with federal Medicaid requirements applicable to
 25 permissible health care-related taxes, including, but not limited
 26 to, Section 433.68 of Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

27 14199.51. The following definitions shall apply for the purposes
 28 of this article:

29 (a) “Alternate Health Care Service Plan” or “AHCSP” means
 30 a nonprofit health care service plan with at least four million
 31 enrollees statewide, that owns or operates pharmacies, and provides
 32 professional medical services to enrollees in specific geographic
 33 regions through an exclusive contract with a single medical group
 34 in each specific geographic region in which it is licensed.

35 (b) “AHCSP enrollee” means an individual enrolled in an
 36 AHCSP, as defined in subdivision (a), who is not a Medi-Cal
 37 beneficiary.

38 (c) “AHCSP enrollee tax amount” means the amount of tax
 39 assessed per countable enrollee within an AHCSP taxing tier.

1 (d) “AHCSP taxing tier” means a range of cumulative
2 enrollment of countable AHCSP enrollees for the base year.

3 (e) “Base year” means the 12-month period of October 1, 2014,
4 through September 30, 2015.

5 (f) “Base data source” means the quarterly financial statement
6 filings submitted by health plans to the Department of Managed
7 Health Care retrieved by the department as of January 1, 2016,
8 and supplemented by, as necessary, Medi-Cal enrollment data for
9 the base year as maintained by the department and retrieved as of
10 January 1, 2016.

11 (g) “Countable enrollee” means an individual enrolled in a health
12 plan, as defined in subdivision (k), during a month of the base year
13 according to the base data source. “Countable enrollee” does not
14 include an individual enrolled in a Medicare plan, a plan-to-plan
15 enrollee, as defined in subdivision (r), or an individual enrolled in
16 a health plan pursuant to the Federal Employees Health Benefits
17 Act of 1959 (Public law 86-382) to the extent the imposition of
18 the tax under this article is preempted pursuant to Section 8909(f)
19 of Title 5 of the United States Code.

20 (h) “Department” means the State Department of Health Care
21 Services.

22 (i) “Director” means the Director of Health Care Services.

23 (j) “Excluded plan” means any of the following:

24 (1) A health plan licensed pursuant to Section 1351.2 of the
25 Health and Safety Code.

26 (2) A health plan that is owned and operated by a 501(c)(3)
27 hospital or health system or multiple 501(c)(3) hospitals or health
28 systems if that health plan has both a substantial amount of its
29 enrollment in and is headquartered in either the County of
30 Sacramento or San Diego.

31 (k) “Health care service plan” or “health plan” means a health
32 care service plan, other than a plan that provides only specialized
33 or discount services, that is licensed by the Department of Managed
34 Health Care under the Knox-Keene Health Care Service Plan Act
35 of 1975 (Chapter 2.2 (commencing with Section 1340) of Division
36 2 of the Health and Safety Code) or a managed care plan contracted
37 with the State Department of Health Care Services to provide
38 Medi-Cal services.

39 (l) “Medi-Cal enrollee” means an individual enrolled in a health
40 plan, as defined in subdivision (k), who is a Medi-Cal beneficiary

1 for whom the department directly pays the health plan a capitated
2 payment.

3 (m) “Medi-Cal per enrollee tax amount” means the amount of
4 tax assessed per countable Medi-Cal enrollee within a Medi-Cal
5 taxing tier.

6 (n) “Medi-Cal taxing tier” means a range of cumulative
7 enrollment of countable Medi-Cal enrollees for the base year.

8 (o) “Other enrollee” means an individual enrolled in a health
9 plan, as defined in subdivision (k), who is not a Medi-Cal
10 beneficiary or an AHCSF enrollee.

11 (p) “Other per enrollee tax amount” means the amount of tax
12 assessed per countable other enrollee within an other taxing tier.

13 (q) “Other taxing tier” means a range of cumulative enrollment
14 of countable other enrollees for the base year.

15 (r) “Plan-to-plan enrollee” means an individual who receives
16 his or her health care services through a health plan pursuant to a
17 subcontract from another health plan.

18 14199.52. (a) The Health and Human Services Special Fund
19 is hereby created in the State Treasury.

20 (b) All revenues, less refunds, derived from the taxes provided
21 for in this article shall be deposited in the State Treasury to the
22 credit of the Health and Human Services Special Fund.

23 (c) Notwithstanding Section 16305.7 of the Government Code,
24 any interest and dividends earned on moneys in the Health and
25 Human Services Special Fund shall be retained in the fund and
26 used solely for the purpose specified in subdivision (d).

27 (d) Notwithstanding Section 13340 of the Government Code,
28 the funds deposited in the Health and Human Services Special
29 Fund pursuant to this article shall be continuously appropriated,
30 without regard to fiscal year, to the department for purposes of
31 funding the nonfederal share of Medi-Cal managed care rates for
32 health care services furnished to children, adults, seniors and
33 persons with disabilities, and persons dually eligible for Medi-Cal
34 and Medicare.

35 (e) The department shall provide an annual report to all health
36 plans accounting for the funds deposited in and expended from
37 the Health and Human Services Special Fund, in a time and manner
38 as deemed appropriate by the director. The report shall identify
39 the taxes imposed on each health plan pursuant to this article, and

1 shall provide an itemized accounting of expenditures from the
2 fund.

3 14199.53. (a) The department shall determine for each health
4 plan using the base data source all of the following:

- 5 (1) Total cumulative enrollment for the base year.
- 6 (2) Total Medicare cumulative enrollment for the base year.
- 7 (3) Total Medi-Cal cumulative enrollment for the base year.
- 8 (4) Total plan-to-plan cumulative enrollment for the base year.
- 9 (5) Total cumulative enrollment through the Federal Employees
10 Health Benefits Act of 1959 (Public Law 86-382) for the base
11 year.

12 (6) Total other cumulative enrollment for the base year that is
13 not otherwise counted in paragraphs (2) to (5), inclusive.

14 (b) Notwithstanding any provision in this article, the director
15 may correct any identified material or significant errors in the data,
16 including, but not limited to, the overall cumulative enrollment,
17 the Medicare cumulative enrollment, Medi-Cal cumulative
18 enrollment, cumulative enrollment through the Federal Employees
19 Health Benefits Act of 1959 (Public Law 86-382), and other
20 cumulative enrollment. The director's determination whether to
21 exercise his or her discretion under this section and any
22 determination made by the director under this section shall not be
23 subject to judicial review, except that a health plan may bring a
24 writ of mandate under Section 1085 of the Code of Civil Procedure
25 to rectify an abuse of discretion by the department in correcting
26 that health plan's data when that correction results in a greater tax
27 amount for that health plan pursuant to Section 14199.55.

28 14199.54. (a) A managed care organization provider tax shall
29 be imposed on each health plan that is not an excluded plan. The
30 tax shall be imposed for the following fiscal years:

- 31 (1) 2016–17 fiscal year.
- 32 (2) 2017–18 fiscal year.
- 33 (3) 2018–19 fiscal year.

34 (b) The department shall compute the annual tax for each health
35 plan subject to the tax during each applicable state fiscal year
36 pursuant to Section 14199.55.

37 (c) The department shall collect the annual tax for each health
38 plan in four installments and shall determine the amount due for
39 each installment in the state fiscal year by dividing the annual tax
40 for that state fiscal year by four.

1 (d) The department shall not collect the tax imposed pursuant
 2 to this article until the department receives approval from the
 3 federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services that this tax
 4 is a permissible health care-related tax in accordance with Section
 5 433.68 of Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations and is
 6 eligible for federal financial participation. On October 1, 2016, or
 7 the date the department receives that federal approval from the
 8 federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, whichever
 9 is later, the following activities shall commence:

10 (1) The director shall certify in writing that federal approval
 11 has been received, and within five business days, the department
 12 shall post the certification on its Internet Web site and send a copy
 13 of the certification to the Secretary of State, the Secretary of the
 14 Senate, the Chief Clerk of the Assembly, and the Legislative
 15 Counsel.

16 (2) By October 14, 2016, or within 10 business days following
 17 receipt of the notice of federal approval, whichever is later, the
 18 department shall send a notice to each health plan subject to the
 19 tax, which shall contain the following information:

20 (A) The annual tax due for each fiscal year.

21 (B) The dates on which the four installment tax payments are
 22 due for each fiscal year.

23 (3) A health plan shall pay the annual tax in installments as
 24 calculated pursuant to Section 14199.55, based on a schedule
 25 developed by the department. The department shall establish the
 26 date that each tax payment is due, provided that the first tax
 27 payment shall be due no earlier than 20 days following the date
 28 the department sends the notice pursuant to paragraph (2), and the
 29 tax payments shall be paid at least one month apart, but no more
 30 than one quarter apart.

31 (4) A health plan shall pay the taxes that are due, if any, in the
 32 amounts and at the times set forth in the notice unless superseded
 33 by a subsequent notice issued by the department.

34 (e) The tax assessed pursuant to this article shall be paid by each
 35 health plan subject to the tax to the department for deposit in the
 36 Health and Human Services Special Fund created pursuant to
 37 Section 14199.52.

38 (f) (1) Interest shall be assessed on an applicable health plan
 39 for any amount of the managed care organization provider taxes
 40 that are not paid on the date due at a rate of 10 percent per annum.

1 Interest shall begin to accrue the day after the date the tax payment
2 was due and shall be deposited in the Health and Human Services
3 Special Fund created pursuant to Section 14199.52.

4 (2) If a tax payment is more than 60 days overdue, a penalty
5 equal to the total accrued interest charge described in paragraph
6 (1) shall also be assessed on the applicable health plan and due for
7 each month for which the tax payment is not received after 60
8 days.

9 (g) (1) Subject to paragraph (2), the director may waive a
10 portion or all of either the interest or penalties, or both, assessed
11 under this article in the event that the director determines, in his
12 or her sole discretion, that the health plan has demonstrated that
13 imposition of the full amount of the tax pursuant to the timelines
14 applicable under this article has a high likelihood of creating an
15 undue financial hardship for the health plan or creates a significant
16 financial difficulty in providing needed services to Medi-Cal
17 beneficiaries.

18 (2) Waiver of some or all of the interest or penalties pursuant
19 to this subdivision shall be conditioned on the health plan's
20 agreement to make tax payments on an alternative schedule
21 developed by the department that takes into account the financial
22 situation of the health plan and the potential impact on the delivery
23 of services to Medi-Cal beneficiaries.

24 (h) In the event of a merger, acquisition, establishment, or any
25 other similar transaction that results in the transfer of health plan
26 responsibility for all countable enrollees under this article from a
27 health plan to another health plan or similar entity, and that occurs
28 at any time during which this article is operative, the resultant
29 health plan or similar entity shall be responsible for paying the full
30 tax amount as provided in this article that would have been the
31 responsibility of the health plan to which that full tax amount was
32 assessed, upon the effective date of any such transaction. If a
33 merger, acquisition, establishment, or any other similar transaction
34 results in the transfer of health plan responsibility for only some
35 of a health plan's countable enrollees under this article but not all
36 countable enrollees, the full tax amount as provided in this article
37 shall remain the responsibility of that health plan to which that full
38 tax amount was assessed.

39 14199.55. (a) For each fiscal year, the Medi-Cal taxing tiers
40 shall be as follows:

- 1 (1) Medi-Cal taxing tier I shall consist of all countable Medi-Cal
- 2 enrollees in a health plan from zero to 2,000,000, inclusive.
- 3 (2) Medi-Cal taxing tier II shall consist of all countable
- 4 Medi-Cal enrollees in a health plan from 2,000,001 to 4,000,000,
- 5 inclusive.
- 6 (3) Medi-Cal taxing tier III shall consist of all countable
- 7 Medi-Cal enrollees in a health plan greater than 4,000,000.
- 8 (b) For each fiscal year, the other taxing tiers shall be as follows:
- 9 (1) Other taxing tier I shall consist of all countable other
- 10 enrollees in a health plan from zero to 4,000,000, inclusive.
- 11 (2) Other taxing tier II shall consist of all countable other
- 12 enrollees in a health plan from 4,000,001 to 8,000,000, inclusive.
- 13 (3) Other taxing tier III shall consist of all countable other
- 14 enrollees in a health plan greater than 8,000,000.
- 15 (c) For each fiscal year, the AHCSF taxing tier shall consist of
- 16 all countable AHCSF enrollees in a health plan from zero to

- 18 (d) For the 2016–17 fiscal year, the Medi-Cal per enrollee tax
- 19 amount for each Medi-Cal taxing tier shall be as follows:
- 20 (1) The Medi-Cal per enrollee tax for Medi-Cal taxing tier I

2 shall be twenty dollars and twenty-five cents (\$20.25).

3 (3) The Medi-Cal per enrollee tax for Medi-Cal taxing tier III
4 shall be one dollar (\$1).

5 (h) For the 2017–18 fiscal year, the other per enrollee tax amount
6 for each other taxing tier shall be as follows:

7 (1) The other per enrollee tax for the other taxing tier I shall be
8 eight dollars (\$8).

9 (2) The other per enrollee tax for the other taxing tier II shall
10 be three dollars (\$3).

11 (3) The other per enrollee tax for the other taxing tier III shall
12 be one dollar (\$1).

13 (i) For the 2017–18 fiscal year, the AHCSF per enrollee tax for
14 the AHCSF taxing tier shall be two dollars and twenty-five cents
15 (\$2.25).

16 (j) For the 2018–19 fiscal year, the Medi-Cal per enrollee tax
17 amount for each Medi-Cal taxing tier shall be as follows:

18 (1) The Medi-Cal per enrollee tax for Medi-Cal taxing tier I
19 shall be forty-five dollars (\$45).

20 (2) The Medi-Cal per enrollee tax for Medi-Cal taxing tier II
21 shall be twenty-one dollars (\$21).

22 (3) The Medi-Cal per enrollee tax for Medi-Cal taxing tier III
23 shall be one dollar (\$1).

24 (k) For the 2018–19 fiscal year, the other per enrollee tax amount
25 for each other taxing tier shall be as follows:

26 (1) The other per enrollee tax for the other taxing tier I shall be
27 eight dollars and fifty cents (\$8.50).

28 (2) The other per enrollee tax for the other taxing tier II shall
29 be three dollars and fifty cents (\$3.50).

30 (3) The other per enrollee tax for the other taxing tier III shall
31 be one dollar (\$1).

32 (l) For the 2018–19 fiscal year, the AHCSF per enrollee tax for
33 the AHCSF taxing tier shall be two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50).

34 (m) (1) The department may modify or make adjustments to
35 any methodology, tax amount, taxing tier, or other similar provision
36 specified in this article to the extent necessary to meet the
37 requirements of federal law or regulations, obtain federal approval,
38 or to ensure federal financial participation is available provided
39 the modification or adjustment does not otherwise conflict with
40 the purposes of this article. Any modification or adjustment that

1 would result in more than the following aggregate tax amounts for
2 the other enrollees and AHCSF enrollees, combined, shall be
3 considered to conflict with the purposes of this article:

4 (A) Two hundred sixty-six million dollars (\$266,000,000) in
5 the 2016–17 fiscal year.

6 (B) Two hundred eighty-seven million dollars (\$287,000,000)
7 in the 2017–18 fiscal year.

10 (2) In implementing any modification or adjustment, the

14 department to make an adjustment that does not impact the amounts
15 in subparagraph (A), (B), or (C) of paragraph (1).

16 (3) If the department identifies that a modification or adjustment
17 may be necessary in accordance with paragraph (1), the department
18 shall consult with affected health plans, to the extent practicable,
19 to implement that modification or adjustment.

20 (4) In the event of a modification or adjustment made pursuant
21 to this subdivision, the department shall notify affected health
22 plans, the Joint Legislative Budget Committee, the Senate
23 Committees on Appropriations, Budget and Fiscal Review, and
24 Health, and the Assembly Committees on Appropriations, Budget,
25 and Health within 10 business days of that modification or
26 adjustment.

27 (n) The department shall request approval from the federal
28 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services as is necessary to
29 implement this article. In making that request, the department may
30 seek, as it deems necessary, a request for waiver of the broad-based
31 requirement, waiver of the uniformity requirement, or both,
32 pursuant to Section 433.68(e)(1) and (2) of Title 42 of the Code
33 of Federal Regulations, or a request for waiver of any other
34 provision of federal law or regulation necessary to implement this
35 article.

36 (o) Notwithstanding Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section
37 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code,
38 the department may implement this article by means of provider
39 bulletins, all plan letters, or other similar instructions, without
40 taking regulatory action. The department shall provide notification

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1 to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee and to the Senate
2 Committees on Appropriations, Budget and Fiscal Review, and
3 Health, and the Assembly Committees on Appropriations, Budget,
4 and Health within 10 business days after the above-described action
5 is taken.
