Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 170—Relative to California Ports Day.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

ACR 170, as introduced, O'Donnell. California Ports Day.

This measure would designate February 21, 2018, and the 3rd Wednesday in February of each year thereafter, as California Ports Day.

- 1 WHEREAS, California is home to the most productive system  
2 of ports in the nation, including three of America's largest container  
3 ports and a diverse system of specialty ports; and  
4 WHEREAS, International trade is a critical component of our  
5 state and national economies and California ports play a vital role  
6 in serving our trade needs; and  
7 WHEREAS, California is blessed with major port facilities  
8 situated along the coast from Humboldt Bay to San Diego Bay,  
9 and along inland waterways in West Sacramento and Stockton;  
10 and  
11 WHEREAS, California is the largest gateway for international  
12 trade and domestic commerce in the nation, with more than 40  
13 percent of the total containerized cargo entering the United States  
14 arriving at California ports and almost 30 percent of the nation's  
15 exports flowing through ports in the Golden State; and

1 WHEREAS, California ports are critical gateways to the state's  
2 freight transportation system, which is responsible for one-third  
3 of the state's economy and jobs, with freight-dependent industries  
4 accounting for over \$700 billion in revenue and more than 5 million  
5 jobs; and

6 WHEREAS, Port activities employ more than 500,000 people  
7 in California and generate an estimated \$9 billion in state and local  
8 tax revenue annually; and

9 WHEREAS, California ports also provide important  
10 noncargo-related services and facilities such as ferry operations,  
11 passenger cruise line services, restaurant and hotel  
12 accommodations, special events, tourist attractions, recreational  
13 harbors and marinas, commercial fishing facilities, and parks and  
14 open space; and

15 WHEREAS, California ports are on the cutting edge of  
16 environmental stewardship, leading the nation, and indeed the  
17 world, in developing environmentally friendly port operations;  
18 and

19 WHEREAS, California ports are reducing air emissions from  
20 port-related operations, improving water quality, protecting marine  
21 wildlife, and implementing environmentally sustainable practices;  
22 and

23 WHEREAS, California ports are making significant and lasting  
24 emissions reductions by encouraging cleaner burning fuels in  
25 vessels, replacing conventional diesel with low emission trucks,  
26 using energy efficient utilities and alternative fuels, investing in  
27 solar and other renewable energy sources, and electrifying cargo  
28 handling equipment; and

29 WHEREAS, California ports have achieved remarkable air  
30 quality improvements over the last decade, with emissions  
31 reductions on the order of 80 percent in particulate matter, 90  
32 percent in sulfur dioxide, and 50 percent in nitrogen dioxide; and

33 WHEREAS, California's public ports manage state tidelands  
34 and other public lands for the benefit of all Californians, serving  
35 as environmental stewards of important resources and economic  
36 engines for the state and for the nation; and

37 WHEREAS, It is critical to work together to ensure that  
38 California ports are able to maintain their competitiveness in the  
39 global marketplace and continue to grow their share of the goods

1 movement industry to benefit all Californians and Americans;  
2 now, therefore, be it

3 *Resolved by the Assembly of the State of California, the Senate*  
4 *thereof concurring,* That the Legislature hereby designates  
5 February 21, 2018, and the third Wednesday in February of each  
6 year thereafter, as California Ports Day; and be it further

7 *Resolved,* That the Legislature encourages all Californians to  
8 learn about our public ports and to observe the day with appropriate  
9 programs, ceremonies, and educational activities; and be it further

- 1) California is home to the most productive system of ports in the nation, including three of America's largest container ports and a diverse system of specialty ports.
- 2) California is the largest gateway for international trade and domestic commerce in the nation, with more than 40 percent of the total containerized cargo entering the United States arriving at California ports and almost 30 percent of the nation's exports flowing through ports in the Golden State.
- 3) California ports are critical gateways to the state's freight transportation system, which is responsible for one-third of the state's economy and jobs, with freight-dependent industries accounting for over \$700 billion in revenue and more than 5 million jobs.
- 4) California ports also provide important noncargo-related services and facilities such as ferry operations, passenger cruise line services, restaurant and hotel accommodations, special events, tourist attractions, recreational harbors and marinas, commercial fishing facilities, and parks and open space.
- 5) California ports are on the cutting edge of environmental stewardship, leading the nation, and indeed the world, in developing environmentally friendly port operations; and are reducing air emissions from port-related operations, improving water quality, protecting marine wildlife, and implementing environmentally sustainable practices.
- 6) It is critical to work together to ensure that California ports are able to maintain their competitiveness in the global marketplace and continue to grow their share of the goods movement industry to benefit all Californians and Americans.

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Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 171—Relative to National Caregivers Day.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL’S DIGEST

ACR 171, as introduced, Eggman. National Caregivers Day.  
This bill would recognize February 16, 2018, as National Caregivers Day.

- 1 WHEREAS, National Caregivers Day was founded by the  
2 Providers Association for Home Health & Hospice Agencies in  
3 2015; and  
4 WHEREAS, National Caregivers Day is observed annually on  
5 the third Friday in February. It was first observed on February 19,  
6 2016; and  
7 WHEREAS, A caregiver is a relative, partner, friend, or neighbor  
8 who has a significant personal relationship with, and provides a  
9 broad range of assistance for, an older person, an adult, or a child  
10 with a chronic or disabling condition; and  
11 WHEREAS, Caregivers are diverse and come from every age,  
12 gender, socioeconomic, and racial or ethnic group; and  
13 WHEREAS, National Caregivers Day recognizes and honors  
14 those women and men dedicated to providing quality,  
15 compassionate care and services every day; and

1 WHEREAS, A 2015 report by the American Association of  
2 Retired Persons (AARP) Public Policy Institute and the National  
3 Alliance for Caregiving found there are an estimated 43.5 million  
4 caregivers in the United States who provide unpaid care to adults  
5 and children each year; and

6 WHEREAS, According to an AARP report, Valuing the  
7 Invaluable, in 2013, there were an estimated 4.45 million caregivers  
8 in California, who provided more than 4.1 billion hours of care  
9 per year for an estimated total economic value of \$57.7 billion  
10 each year; and

11 WHEREAS, Caregivers serve diverse populations, with the  
12 majority serving seniors who require assistance; and

13 WHEREAS, In California, the number of seniors 60 years of  
14 age and older continues to grow rapidly. Between 1970 and 2016,  
15 the number of older adults in the state grew from 2.5 million to  
16 7.8 million, a 212-percent increase; and

17 WHEREAS, Others are caregivers to the state's 62,035 abused  
18 and neglected children and youth in foster care; and

19 WHEREAS, There are also many devoted military caregivers  
20 who tend to members of our Armed Forces when they return home  
21 and face disabling physical injury or mental illness; and

22 WHEREAS, There are 5.5 million spouses, parents, children,  
23 and friends caring for wounded, ill, and injured military personnel  
24 and veterans; and

25 WHEREAS, Caregiving responsibilities fall more heavily on  
26 women, many of whom are older with health problems of their  
27 own; and

28 WHEREAS, Six out of 10 family caregivers in the country are  
29 women; and

30 WHEREAS, One in three female caregivers provide more than  
31 20 hours of care per week; and

32 WHEREAS, Sixty percent of female caregivers report high  
33 levels of physical strain, and 41 percent report high levels of  
34 emotional stress, as a result of caregiving; and

35 WHEREAS, The Legislature has taken steps to better serve the  
36 needs of caregivers through policy that supports workplace  
37 flexibility, such as paid family leave, unemployment insurance for  
38 family caregivers, and paid sick days; now, therefore, be it

2     *thereof concurring*, That the Legislature recognizes February 16,  
3     2018, as National Caregivers Day; and be it further

4     *Resolved*, On National Caregivers Day, the Legislature reaffirms

**SUMMARY:** Recognizes February 16, 2018, as National Caregivers Day and honors those women and men dedicated to providing quality, compassionate care and services every day. Specifically, **this resolution** makes the following legislative findings:

- 1) National Caregivers Day was founded by the Providers Association for Home Health and Hospice Agencies in 2015; and, is observed annually on the third Friday in February.
- 2) A caregiver is a relative, partner, friend, or neighbor who has a significant personal relationship with, and provides a broad range of assistance for, an older person, an adult, or a child with a chronic or disabling condition.
- 3) A 2015 report by the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) Public Policy Institute and the National Alliance for Caregiving found there are an estimated 43.5 million caregivers in the United States who provide unpaid care to adults and children each year.
- 4) According to an AARP report, Valuing the Invaluable, in 2013, there were an estimated 4.45 million caregivers in California, who provided more than 4.1 billion hours of care per year for an estimated total economic value of \$57.7 billion each year.
- 5) Caregivers serve diverse populations, with the majority serving seniors who require assistance. Others are caregivers to the state's 62,035 abused and neglected children and youth in foster care.
- 6) There are 5.5 million spouses, parents, children, and friends caring for wounded, ill, and injured military personnel and veterans.
- 7) Caregiving responsibilities fall more heavily on women, many of whom are older with health problems of their own. Six out of 10 family caregivers in the country are women and one in three female caregivers provide more than 20 hours of care per week.
- 8) The Legislature has taken steps to better serve the needs of caregivers through policy that supports workplace flexibility, such as paid family leave, unemployment insurance for family caregivers, and paid sick days.
