HR 12 (Gipson) – As Introduced January 31, 2019

SUBJECT: Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day.

SUMMARY: Proclaims February 7, 2019, as Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day in California in order to encourage greater awareness, education, community engagement, and treatment among black communities. Specifically, this resolution makes the following legislative findings:

- 1) More than 1.2 million people living in the United States are infected with human immunodeficiency virus (HIV).
- 2) In 2014, five states, including California, made up almost one-half of all new HIV diagnoses in the United States. In 2015, the overall rate of new HIV diagnoses among black individuals is more than four times the rate of white individuals; and, in 2016 there were 5,061 new diagnoses of HIV, 955 of which were African Americans.
- 3) The rate of black men living with HIV is two and one-half times that of white men and the rate of black women living with HIV is 9.4 times that of white women.
- 4) A much higher proportion of LGBTQ individuals have HIV compared to any other group in the United States, and therefore have an increased chance of having an HIV-positive partner.
- 5) One in two people with HIV have had the virus at least three years before diagnosis and about 40 percent of new HIV infections come from people who don't know they have HIV.
- 6) We should encourage friends and family to get tested at least once, and people at high risk should be tested at least once a year.
- 7) Due to stigmatization and marginalization, the black community is at heightened risk for HIV, while also not being targeted with increased HIV supportive services.
- 8) The theme of the 2019 National Black HIV/AID Awareness Day is "Stay The Course. The Fight is Not Over!"
