**No. 12**

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**Introduced by Assembly Members Gipson and Gloria**

January 31, 2019

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House Resolution No. 12—Relative to Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day.

1 WHEREAS, More than 1.2 million people living in the United  
2 States are infected with human immunodeficiency virus (HIV),  
3 and one in eight is unaware of the infection; and  
4 WHEREAS, In 2014, five states, including California, made up  
5 almost one-half of all new HIV diagnoses in the United States;  
6 and  
7 WHEREAS, In 2016, there were 5,061 new diagnoses of HIV,  
8 955 of which were African Americans; and  
9 WHEREAS, The rate of black men living with HIV is two and  
10 one-half times that of white men and the rate of black women  
11 living with HIV is 9.4 times that of white women; and  
12 WHEREAS, The overall rate of new HIV diagnoses among  
13 black individuals is more than four times the rate of white  
14 individuals in 2015; and  
15 WHEREAS, A much higher proportion of LGBTQ individuals  
16 have HIV compared to any other group in the United States, and  
17 therefore have an increased chance of having an HIV-positive  
18 partner; and  
19 WHEREAS, One in two people with HIV have had the virus at  
20 least three years before diagnosis and about 40 percent of new  
21 HIV infections come from people who don't know they have HIV;

1 WHEREAS, We should encourage friends and family to get  
2 tested at least once, and people at high risk should be tested at least  
3 once a year; and

4 WHEREAS, Due to stigmatization and marginalization, the  
5 black community is at heightened risk for HIV, while also not  
6 being targeted with increased HIV supportive services; and

7 WHEREAS, The theme of the 2019 National Black HIV/AIDS  
8 Awareness Day is “Stay The Course. The Fight is Not Over!”;  
9 now, therefore, be it

10 *Resolved by the Assembly of the State of California*, That the  
11 Assembly proclaims February 7, 2019, as Black HIV/AIDS  
12 Awareness Day in California in order to encourage greater  
13 awareness, education, community engagement, and treatment  
14 among black communities; and be it further

15 *Resolved*, That the Chief Clerk of the Assembly transmit copies

**SUBJECT:** Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day.

**SUMMARY:** Proclaims February 7, 2019, as Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day in California in order to encourage greater awareness, education, community engagement, and treatment among black communities. Specifically, **this resolution** makes the following legislative findings:

- 1) More than 1.2 million people living in the United States are infected with human immunodeficiency virus (HIV).
- 2) In 2014, five states, including California, made up almost one-half of all new HIV diagnoses in the United States. In 2015, the overall rate of new HIV diagnoses among black individuals is more than four times the rate of white individuals; and, in 2016 there were 5,061 new diagnoses of HIV, 955 of which were African Americans.
- 3) The rate of black men living with HIV is two and one-half times that of white men and the rate of black women living with HIV is 9.4 times that of white women.
- 4) A much higher proportion of LGBTQ individuals have HIV compared to any other group in the United States, and therefore have an increased chance of having an HIV-positive partner.
- 5) One in two people with HIV have had the virus at least three years before diagnosis and about 40 percent of new HIV infections come from people who don't know they have HIV.
- 6) We should encourage friends and family to get tested at least once, and people at high risk should be tested at least once a year.
- 7) Due to stigmatization and marginalization, the black community is at heightened risk for HIV, while also not being targeted with increased HIV supportive services.
- 8) The theme of the 2019 National Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day is "Stay The Course. The Fight is Not Over!"
