House Resolution No. 90—Relative to Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month.

1 WHEREAS, March is recognized nationwide as Developmental
2 Disabilities Awareness Month, and this year’s awareness month
3 looks to focus on the inclusion of people with developmental
4 disabilities in all areas of community life, as well as awareness to
5 the barriers that people with developmental disabilities still
6 sometimes face in education, employment, and community living;
7 and

8 WHEREAS, The United States Congress enacted the
9 Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act (DD
10 Act) in 2000, and a precursor in 1975, to ensure that individuals
11 with developmental disabilities and their families can access quality
12 services and supports that promote self-determination,
13 independence, productivity, integration, and inclusion in all facets
14 of community life; and

15 WHEREAS, The California Legislature enacted the Lanterman
16 Developmental Disabilities Services Act in 1973 and amended it
17 in 1977; and

18 WHEREAS, As of January 1, 2020, the population of California
19 was 39,960,000. An estimated 719,640 Californians are living with
20 a developmental disability and 350,047 of them are served by
21 regional centers; and

22 WHEREAS, Continued information and acceptance are effective
23 and informative methods to help address the societal barriers faced

1 by people with developmental disabilities in being fully included
2 in all aspects of community life; and

3 WHEREAS, The general public is increasingly aware and
4 accepting that disabilities should not prevent individuals from
5 being fully included at school, work, or home as members of their
6 families and communities; and

7 WHEREAS, By observing Developmental Disabilities
8 Awareness Month, California recognizes leaders who have sought
9 to bring people with developmental disabilities into the
10 conversation, including the statewide programs funded under the
11 DD Act, such as the State Council on Developmental Disabilities
12 and Disability Rights California, and other advocates and service
13 providers, such as The Arc, the California Disability Services
14 Association, Futures Explored, Inc., Disability Voices United, the
15 California Disability Community Action Network, and the
16 Association of Regional Center Agencies; now, therefore, be it

17 *Resolved by the Assembly of the State of California*, That the
18 Assembly recognizes the month of March 2020 as Developmental
19 Disabilities Awareness Month, commends the efforts of the
20 individuals and organizations that have worked diligently to
21 increase awareness and acceptance of people with developmental
22 disabilities, and celebrates and supports the diversity of the human
23 condition, particularly individuals who experience developmental
24 disabilities; and be it further

25 *Resolved*, That the Chief Clerk of the Assembly transmit copies

SUBJECT: Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month.

SUMMARY: Recognizes the month of March 2020 as Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month and commends the efforts of the individuals and organizations that have worked diligently to increase awareness and acceptance of people with developmental disabilities. Specifically, **this resolution** makes the following legislative findings:
