#### LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SCR 58, as amended, McGuire. California Grown Flower Month. This measure would proclaim June 2017 as California Grown Flower Month to recognize and honor the men and women of the California grown flower industry for their dedication and productivity.

- 1 WHEREAS, California's flower industry dates back to the late
- 2 1870s, when Theodosia B. Shepherd was inspired to sell calla lilies
- 3 grown in her garden; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The industry of selling grown flowers began to
- 5 flourish and by the turn of the century most towns had at least one
- 6 florist; and
- WHEREAS, In 1890, the Domoto family established California's
- 8 first commercial flower farm in Oakland; and
- 9 WHEREAS, To this day, California still has a year-round climate 10 that is perfect for growing hundreds of varieties of flowers; and
- WHEREAS, California flowers are grown *on* over 701 million
- 12 square feet spanning the distance 16,000 acres of California's most
- 13 fertile farmlands from the City of San Diego, through the Inland
- 14 Empire to the coastal City of Carpinteria, and up to the Oregon
- 15 border; and

WHEREAS, California is the largest producing state of fresh cut flowers in the country representing approximately 80 percent of all cut flowers grown in the United States; and

WHEREAS, California is the leading producer of lilies, irises, gerbera daisies, tulips, roses and orchids; and

WHEREAS, Much of the production of lilies, irises, and tulips is in the County of Humboldt, which is known for its ideal growing conditions, and is also where the legendary Stargazer lily was originally bred; and

WHEREAS, Approximately 50 percent of all California grown flowers are distributed to wholesale and retail customers outside of the state; and

WHEREAS, The economic activity of California flower farmers, wholesalers, and retail florists creates nearly 145,665 jobs in the state; and

WHEREAS, The total economic impact of business activity created by California-grown flower farmers', wholesalers', and retail florists' expenditures in the state is more than \$12.2 billion; and

WHEREAS, The amount of money generated by the California grown flower industry for additional jobs in the state is more than \$12.5 million per day; and

WHEREAS, The economic activities of California grown flower farmers, wholesalers, and retail florists generate nearly \$1.1 billion in additional taxes; and

WHEREAS, It is appropriate for all Californians to recognize our California grown flower farmers, wholesalers, retail florists, and others involved in providing such a bounty to our state and the nation; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate of the State of California, the Assembly thereof concurring, That the Legislature recognizes and honors the men and women of the California grown flower industry for their dedication and productivity and hereby proclaims the month of June 2017 as California Grown Flower Month; and be it further

**SENATE VOTE**: 40-0

**SUBJECT**: California Grown Flower Month

**SUMMARY:** Proclaims the month of June 2017 as California Grown Flower Month to recognize and honor the men and women of the California grown flower industry for their dedication and productivity. Specifically, **this resolution** makes the following legislative findings:

- 1) California's flower industry dates back the late 1870's, when Theodosia B. Shepherd was inspired to sell calla lilies grown in her garden. The industry of selling grown flowers began to flourish and by the turn of the century most towns had at least one florist.
- 2) In 1890, the Domoto family established California's first commercial flower farm in Oakland. California flowers are now grown on over 16,000 acres of California's most fertile farmlands from the City of San Diego, through the Inland Empire to the coastal City of Carpinteria, and up to the Oregon border.
- 3) To this day, California still has a year-round climate that is perfect for growing hundreds of varieties of flowers.
- 4) California is the largest producing state of fresh cut flowers in the country representing approximately 80 percent of all cut flowers grown in the United States and approximately 50 percent of all those flowers are distributed to wholesale and retail customers outside of the state.
- 5) The economic activities of California grown flower farmers, wholesalers, and retail florists generate \$1.1 billion in additional taxes. The total economic impact of business activity created by California-grown flower farmers', wholesalers', and retail florists' expenditures in the state is more than \$12.2 billion.

#### LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SCR 61, as introduced, Nguyen. Veterans of the Republic of Vietnam Armed Forces Day.

This measure would proclaim June 19, 2017, as Veterans of the Republic of Vietnam Armed Forces Day.

- 2 about the loss of approximately 250,000 members of the armed
- 3 forces of the Republic of Vietnam and 58,000 members of the

- 5 WHEREAS, More than 300,000 members of the United States
- 6 Armed Forces and more than 1,000,000 members of the armed 7 forces of the Republic of Vietnam were injured; and
- 8 WHEREAS, After the fall of Saigon on April 30, 1975, more
- 9 than 250,000 members of the armed forces of the Republic of
- 10 Vietnam were sent to reeducation camps, where many spent up to
- 11 17 years in captivity and more than 20,000 died before they were
- 12 released; and
- WHEREAS, Thousands of veterans of the armed forces of the
- 14 Republic of Vietnam now reside in the United States and participate
- 15 in activities sponsored by American veterans, including Memorial
- 16 Day, and today there are an estimated 100,000 veterans from the

WHEREAS, All veterans who risked their lives fighting for freedom should be honored for their distinguished service in the Vietnam War and for the contributions they provide to the United States as American citizens, and it is the intent of the State of California to honor the sacrifices, commitment, dedication, and courage of everyone who fought for the freedom of the Republic of Vietnam; and

WHEREAS, The State of California recognizes the importance behind the principles of individual freedom in a just society promoting human rights and dignity, and joins with the veterans of the Republic of Vietnam to designate June 19 as a day of remembrance for Americans and Vietnamese who fought side by side for the ideals and values of democracy; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate of the State of California, the Assembly thereof concurring, That the Legislature recognizes June 19, 2017, as Veterans of the Republic of Vietnam Armed Forces Day, in memory of the soldiers who sacrificed their lives for freedom and democracy and the victims of the Vietnam War, and in honor of the survivors, activists, and freedom fighters of that war; and be it further

## ASSEMBLY COMMITTEE ON RULES Ken Cooley, Chair SCR 61 (Nguyen) – As Introduced June 5, 2017

**SENATE VOTE**: 34-0

**SUBJECT**: Veterans of the Republic of Vietnam Armed Forces Day

**SUMMARY:** Proclaims June 19, 2017, as Veterans of the Republic of Vietnam Armed Forces Day in honor of the sacrifices, commitment, dedication, and courage of everyone who fought for the freedom of the Republic of Vietnam. Specifically, **this resolution** makes the following legislative findings:

- 1) From 1965 to 1975, the Vietnam War brought about the loss of approximately 250,000 members of the armed forces of the Republic of Vietnam and 58,000 members of the United States Armed Forces fighting for the cause of freedom.
- 2) More than 300,000 members of the United States Armed Forces and more than 1,000,000 members of the armed forces of the Republic of Vietnam were injured.
- 3) After the fall of Saigon on April 30, 1975, more than 250,000 members of the armed forces of the Republic of Vietnam were sent to reeducation camps, where many spent up to 17 years in captivity and more than 20,000 died before they were released.
- 4) Thousands of veterans of the armed forces of the Republic of Vietnam now reside in the United States and participate in activities sponsored by American veterans, including Memorial Day. Today it is estimated that 100,000 veterans from the Republic of Vietnam are living in California.
- 5) All veterans who risked their lives fighting for freedom should be honored for their distinguished service in the Vietnam War and for the contributions they provide to the United States as American citizens.
